#### **Points to Ponder**

#### MAGIC WORDS

"Don't forget the magic words."

This sentence was part of the sign-off of one of the beloved TV characters of my early childhood. When I was about five years old, I used to watch a local TV program while living in Hackettstown, New Jersey. Of the three channels we got on that old 19" screen TV, one of them showed my favorite program every morning – "Wee Willie Winkie's Wonderful Cartoon Show." Wee Willie Winkie was the guy who announced the next Bug's Bunny cartoon and was, in reality, the TV station's weekend weatherman. But during the week, he would put on an outrageous patchwork sport coat, a fedora, and a pair of dark sunglasses, and the weatherman transformed into the host of my favorite show.

One of the things that stuck with me from 1966 (now referred to as "the middle of the last century") was how he closed every show. This fellow would always end by saying, "don't forget the magic words – please, thank you, you're welcome, and excuse me." Then he would say, "and remember to attend the church or synagogue of your choice." I cannot imagine a TV host doing that today. Perhaps the closest we have is the phrase uttered by Drew Carey as popularized by his predecessor, Bob Barker, "don't forget to have your pets spayed or neutered." Just doesn't have the same ring, does it?

What highlights the difference for me is that we live in an age where respect is a quaint notion and common courtesy has become far too uncommon. In 1 Peter 2:17 we are called to, "show proper respect to everyone, love the family of believers, fear God, honor the emperor." Respect is something that should be a component of how we conduct ourselves every day. We are to show respect to everyone, even when we disagree or find ourselves provoked. In 1 Thessalonians, Paul teaches that we are to "earn the respect" of outsiders by how we treat them and represent Christ. Paul repeatedly addresses this in 1 Timothy where he mentions several times that various groups of believers should demonstrate that they are "worthy of respect."

How would showing respect to one another change our homes... our church... or our community? Courtesy and respect cost us nothing to give but offer great dividends in our interactions and relationships with others. It is possible that through the use of basic courtesies, we may open the door to someone's heart to share Christ. Regardless, when it comes to living the Christian life, let's make an effort to remember the magic words.
